Previously she has served as president of the League of Women Voters of Orange County for the past four years.

Under her leadership the membership increased by 300%, a new monthly TV program called HOT TOPICS was initiated with Community Access TV, and LWVOC was awarded the top recognition for a Voter Services Campaign by the national LWV.

Graduating with an MBA from Columbia University, and a BA from New York University, Macnab has worked for the New York City prison system, Dun & Bradstreet, Bankers Trust, and Manville Corporation, and was president of her own direct marketing consulting firm. She was elected to the Board of Education in Nashville, TN (70,000 students), and appointed by Mayor Shirley Franklin of Atlanta to serve as her designate on the Fulton County Library Board, prior to moving to the Orlando area. In addition to her leadership role with the League, she was a member of the board of MyRegion.org, a seven county visioning coalition in Central Florida, former member of WMFE's Citizen's Advisory Board, and a number of other local civic boards and organizations. Macnab was most recently recognized by the ORLANDO SENTINEL as a runner up for the 2008 Most Influential Central Floridian of the Year.
